

She was b. Jan. 19, 1671-2; d. Nov. 7, 1699; he is mentioned in the will of his father-in-law, Hugh Dunn in 1691.

VI. Samuel, b. at Piscataway, Sept. 7, 1672; d. Oct. 1, 1682.

VII. Jane, b. Jan. 29, 1675; d. Feb. 23, 1675-6.

VIII. Priscilla, b. Nov. 11, 1677. Her further record is unknown. It is suggestive that a Priscilla Langstaff appears in the record.

IX. Nicholas, b. -; d. -; This is given in some family records, but nothing concerning him appears in N.F. records.

It remained to the lot of the son, Hezekiah, to perpetuate the family name in Piscataway. In one provision of his father's will he is named as "sole heir". In 1697 he "made conveyance of the home lot". Daily in his "History of Woodbridge credit the founders of the Piscataway B. Ch. as being six in number - one of them being Nicholas Bonham", but that was found to be a mistake, for Nicholas had been dead nearly five years. It was his son, Hezekiah, who was one of the prominent seceders from the regular Baptist Church and founder of the Seventh Day Baptist Church in Piscataway in about 1707.
