Dear Historical Association,

In accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, ARCH<sup>2</sup>, Inc. is conducting a cultural resources investigation for Amtrak's New Jersey High Speed Rail Improvement Project. This project, which received federal funds in 2011 from the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation via the Federal Railroad Administration, consists of:

- Upgrades or replacement of catenary, power, track, and signal systems on approximately 23 miles of the Northeast Corridor (NEC) from milepost 56 in Hamilton Township, Mercer County to milepost 32.95 in New Brunswick, Middlesex County
- Construction of a new substation within Amtrak's Adams MOW Yard in North Brunswick
- Construction of two new power frequency converter units on PSEG property at 234 Pierson Avenue, Edison
- Abandonment of the existing aerial lines and steel structures that run between the PSEG property and the Northeast Corridor and replacing them with cables that will run within existing underground conduits
- Use of the Morrisville, Barracks, Fairgrounds, Midway, Adams MOW, Studebaker, and County Yards for equipment storage during construction
- Fencing / guide rail installation at specific locations where there are safety concerns (e.g., Dean Pond's Lane and Schalks access road)
- Interlocking improvements at New York Penn Station

The purpose of the cultural resources investigation is to identify significant archaeological or historic architectural resources that may be affected by the proposed project. As the Section 106 review process encourages participation by individuals and

organizations knowledgeable in historic resources, we are reaching out to you to ask for your input. We have enclosed for your reference:

- an overview map showing the 23-mile length of the project corridor; and
- two maps depicting the specific project locations within the City of New Brunswick on the New Brunswick USGS quadrangle sheet.






