HISTORY OF STATION.

Was Erected Sixty Years Ago and Has Done Good Service.

The old George street station, which is about to be torn down, was erected about 1840. The First Baptist Church used to be on the station site. Trains then ran from Camden to this city and the passengers were then transferred across the Albany street bridge to the New York train on the other side. Many passengers took dinner here on the trip at the old McCormick Hotel.

The property was sold to the railroad for \$6,327.50. The station has been altered many times since then, the platform being lowered and outside decorated. It will now be torn down speedily. The curtains were all drawn to-day.

The first ticket sold at the new temporary station yesterday was excursion ticket No. 3, Y33, to Freehold, for the 9.34 o'clock train.
